Young Hawg Hawler Carries Team to #1 Spot

11 year old Chuck Beach and his partner Charlie Beach (father and club Secretary) bested a 26 boat field to take top honors at Stockton April 7-8. Chuck more than carried his "weight" with 5 of the teams 9 fish total, including Saturday Big Bass. Mother Nature served up 25-30 mph South winds and 80° temps for Saturday afternoon. Sunday's weather had much less wind and warmed to similar temps, water was about 1' above power pool, and ranged from lower 50's to low 60's depending on lake location. The Beach team made the run to the South end of the Sac Arm to find their fish in the backs of coves.


Directions

We are at Plaza Beach Resort on the Niangua Arm of the lake this year. To get there, from Camdenton follow Hwy 5 North to lake Road 5-71, take a left and follow the signs to Plaza Beach on the right.

12" Spotted Bass Legal for Ozarks

Legal minimum length for Spotted or "Kentucky" Bass will be 12" at Lake of the Ozarks (Largemouth and Smallmouth are still 15"). Here is how to properly ID them. Also, feel free to check with club officers prior to weigh-in if you are in doubt.
