Bob Ray and son James took 1st Place honors at Wappapello the weekend of August 12-13. Their winning bag of 17 fish for the weekend was anchored by James' 4.66 lber, which also took Big Bass on Sunday.

Wappapello's no minimum size limit on Bass helped club members capture 14 individual 5 fish limits over the weekend, and set a new all time club record of 234 total fish caught in a tournament.
