


Ray & Shands Take Top Honors at Truman


Top 24 boat field

Last Tournament of 2001 Lake of the Ozarks

October 6-7 at Plaza Beach Resort

As has been the tradition - the Hawa Hawler season will wind down with our fall Lake of the Ozarks tournament. Like the spring tournament, Plaza Beach on the Niangua Arm of the Lake is where it's at. Last year's October Ozarks tournament was won by Gene & Teddy Reim, fishing spinnerbaits. They had a 12 fish bag totaling just short of 26 lbs. Sure hope to see you at Ozarks, Gene.

Directions

From Camdenton follow Hwy 5 North to Lake Road 5-71 (just before the 5 bridge), take a left and follow the signs to Plaza Beach on the right.

IMPORTANT - New Criteria for Spotted Bass

12" will be the minimum length limit for Spotted (Kentucky) Bass: the Largemouth minimum will be 15" as usual. Per recommendation from the Missouri Department of Conservation, the following criteria will be used to determine Spotted Bass at weigh-in:

1. Rough Patch on Tongue

- If the fish DOES NOT have a rough patch, it is not . a Spotted Bass and must be 15".
- If the fish DOES have a rough patch, it may be a Spotted Bass - proceed to Criteria #2.

2. Jaw Length

- With mouth closed, if the upper jaw DOES NOT extend beyond the back of the eye, it is a Spotted Bass, and must be 12".
- With mouth closed, if the upper jaw DOES extend beyond the back of the eye, it is not a Spotted Bass and must be 15"

After the above, if you are still in doubt - it would be best to release the fish if it's not 15", the fine for a short Largemouth is around \$120.
