From the Tournament Chairman's Boat

Our Bass Club

One of the steps a person can take to becoming a more successful angler is to join a bass club. You can gain knowledge and learn techniques from fellow anglers who share the same amount of enthusiasm for bass fishing. The camaraderie and friendships that can develop are invaluable. That said, all bass clubs are not the same and it is up to you to determine what it is you want out of a bass club.

One of the things that struck me early on with the Hawg Hawlers Bass Club was the helpfulness and concern each member has for one another. It was about my third fishing tournament with the club and I was fishing with a fellow member in his boat. We were telling fishing stories to each other and enjoying the day on the water. His cell phone began ringing and he stopped fishing to answer it. I stopped watching my line and turned to look at him while he was talking on the phone. Right then I felt a pull on my Carolina rig and I looked back to see my line moving sideways. I went to set the hook but it was too late and I missed the fish. I reeled my line in quickly in an effort to hurry and make another cast but my partner looked at me and said "pack it up we got to go". I looked back at him and said I just missed a fish what do you mean we got to go? He explained to me that the phone call was from a fellow angler who needed help. So without hesitation we strapped the rods down and left that cove quickly. Within a few minutes we came up on the stranded members and tossed them a rope. We towed them back to the dock at Schooner Creek Resort and after about an hour or so we went back to fishing. I was told numerous stories of situations where fellow Hawg Hawler members were in need of help and other members came to do whatever they could to help out.

Last year I was traveling down to Table Rock Lake following along with other Hawg Hawler members and one of the tires on my trailer blew out. I pulled over to change it and everyone else pulled over as well. I opened the back of my truck to begin the digging process for my tire tools and before I even moved anything another member came up to me with their four way lug wrench and tire jack. I look at her and said okay lets do it. Several people helped and it was like a pit crew at the race track. We were back on the highway in a matter of minutes.

I had a situation in which my boat motor would not start while my partner and I were out on the water and a phone call to another member got us towed back to our resort's dock in short order. The next morning while trolling my boat over to the ramp to get it up on the trailer, my trolling motor shot craps. Once again our fellow bass club members were there to help me get my boat out. By the time I got back to the water with my boat motor fixed and a new trolling motor, it was after take off time and two of our club members stayed behind and waited until we got there. You see we needed to have someone there to check our live wells so that we could still fish the tournament. I will not forget those two giving up valuable fishing time to help us.

A bass club is only as good as the people who make it up. Hawg Hawlers is made up of some of the best people you can find anywhere. That's our bass club.
