What's New 2017

New Officer - This year we welcome Bob Shibe as Co-Vice President. Bob was the Angler of the Year last year and broke more records than Michael Phelps. A big thank you to Bob for stepping up and helping out the club. As a reminder, if anyone is interested in volunteering to be a club officer for 2018 please let us know. We would need to know before September, but the sooner the better!

Weigh in Photos - After weigh-in, we are limiting the number of fish you hold for photographs to two per person (one fish per hand). While it is nice to see a full limit of fish, it is more stressful on them as often fingers are shoved up their gills and the time they spend out of water is prolonged. We ask that you take your two best fish, get your photo snapped and quickly return your fish to the water.

Dead Fish - We all do the best we can to keep our fish alive and healthy, but sometimes despite our efforts, we are faced with a dead fish in our livewell. You are allowed to weigh in a dead fish, however, your team will be assessed a 1/4 lb penalty toward your total weight. Once you place a fish in your livewell, it is automatically included in your daily limit. You can only cull a fish if you are in a bona fide catch and release bass tournament from

September to June and the fish is released unharmed. There is no culling in July or August and you can not

cull a dead fish! This is state law.

We ask if you do have a dead fish, please take responsibility and ensure that the fish gets filleted and eaten. A largemouth bass is a revered game fish and you could possibly face a "wanton waste" fine for throwing dead fish back into the lake after you have placed it in your livewell. If you do eat bass, please bring a fillet knife and some zip-lock bags with you and let others know you will take their dead fish. It sheds a negative light on the club to see any number of nice bass floating around the dock. Let's all do a better job to make sure this doesn't happen in 2017.

New Membership Form - there have been several requests form members wanting contact information for other members. The membership form has been modified to include a check box to select if you would like to share your personal information (phone, address and email) with other members. If you do NOT want your information released, DO NOT check the box on the membership form. Note - we will NEVER share your contact information with outside companies or individuals. As a reminder, a new membership form is needed every year. Do not send in a tournament entry form without a membership form unless one has already been sent and is in file with the Treasurer. A new form is required even if you qualify for Free membership.

A word about safety....

Most of us have heard the story about a recent FLW College Fishing tournament in which two members of University of Florida's bass fishing team were ejected from their boat at nearly 60 mph. If you haven't seen it, I recommend that you search the web for the video to get a lesson in how quickly things can go wrong in a moving bass boat. The incident was caused due to a steering part failure and was not due to negligent or careless driving. Thankfully, nobody was hurt and the team credited FLW for requiring all teams to wear life jackets and use kill switches. Had it not been for the kill switch, the engine and propeller would have continued to run, putting them in more danger.

The state of Missouri requires boaters to have a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket on board and accessible for each occupant of the boat. Children under the age of seven are required to wear a life jacket whenever they are on a boat unless they are in the cabin area of a houseboat or cruiser.

Our club requires that you wear a lifejacket and have your kill switch attached at take-off. While not required afterwards, it is highly recommended that you always wear your lifejacket with your kill switch engaged when the big motor is running. As evidenced by the story above, anything can happen when you are on the water and it is best to exercise caution and live to fish another day.

Let's Get Ready

Our poor bass boats have been sitting idle for the last few months and it is finally time to start dusting them off and getting them ready for the season. Don't let an unexpected surprise ruin your first outing on the water. One thing I always do is make a checklist so I know I haven't forgotten anything. There's nothing worse than having a bearing go out while towing your boat down to the lake or having dead batteries when you show up at the ramp. Below is a list I use to get ready for the season:

Other Tips:

- If you are unsure about the quality of fuel in your boat (can't remember if you used a stabilizer or not) siphon the gas out and use this gas for your lawn mowers. Fill up your tank with fresh gas.
- After a few minutes of towing your boat for the first time, stop somewhere after a few miles to check the trailer bearings. Feel the tire first to see if it is hot. Move your hand slowly toward the center to feel the wheel for heat. DO NOT just immediately grab the wheel because it can severely burn your hand if a bearing has gone out.

To Piedmont Park Recreation Area - Take Highway 55 South to Highway 67 South. Follow Hwy 67 to Highway 34 West. Follow Hwy 34 to the city of Piedmont. Continue Hwy 34 through the city of Piedmont until you reach the WalMart store. Make a right onto Highway HH and follow for approximately 7 miles to the Clearwater Lake Dam. Make a right at the T intersection on top of the dam onto County Road #418 and follow to the Piedmont Park Recreation Area. The park entrance will be on your left. There is a big parking lot and a boat ramp large enough to launch multiple boats.


